Susquehanna Health is moving forward five years ahead of schedule with construction of a new Surgery Center in the Susquehanna Tower at Williamsport Regional Medical Center. The new Surgery Center will accommodate a growing demand, improve the patient experience and bring the latest in heart and vascular technologies and procedures to the region. Expected to be completed as early as December 2015, phase one of the Surgery Center will house two state-of-the-art general operating rooms, one for robotic surgery and a second for cardiothoracic

operations. The facility will bring all heart and vascular invasive procedures together, with two new heart catheterization labs and two electrophysiology labs.

"Everything is coming together ahead of schedule. Patient demand is increasing. Our recruitment of highly skilled surgeons and staff has been phenomenal. We have this exciting challenge of accommodating higher volumes and more complex procedures with a state-of-the-art surgical center," explains Lori Beucler, Susquehanna Health's Vice President and

Chief Nursing Officer. "Fortunately, the forward-thinking tower design included space for surgical services to expand. The amazing support from our community and good use of resources in other renovation and expansion projects are enabling us to move forward on the Surgery Center ahead of schedule."

At the Heart of the Center

Patient demand accelerated after Susquehanna Health Heart & Vascular Institute's affiliation with Cleveland Clinic's Sydell and Arnold Miller Family



Medical Director of the Heart & Vascular Institute. "Referring doctors and hospitals that had drifted away are returning with renewed enthusiasm because of our revitalized treatment strategy that's keeping pace with changes in technology and an integrated approach to heart and vascular care."

There is plenty of momentum to keep volumes increasing, including a dedicated program that enables Susquehanna Health Heart & Vascular cardiologists to serve patients in Jersey Shore, Lewisburg, Lock Haven and Wellsboro. With services provided at these satellite locations,

patients in the region experience improved coordination of care, easy transition of medical records and an overall higher quality with better outcomes in their cardiovascular care.

Heart and Vascular Institute in February 2014. Since the affiliation, there has been a 32.6 percent increase in the number of heart surgeries performed at Williamsport Regional Medical Center. There also has been an 18 percent increase in the number of catheterization lab procedures and three times as many mitral valve cases compared to the previous year.

"Cardiac surgery volumes alone have increased from less than 100 to nearly 350 cases per year," says **Dr. Michael Lazar**,

The additional support of Cleveland Clinic colleagues for consultations and the introduction of technology such as ECMO, a pump that can circulate blood through an artificial lung back into a patient's bloodstream for life-sustaining treatment, are enabling Susquehanna Health Heart & Vascular Institute to perform more high-risk and complex procedures, too.

"Through the affiliation, we are gaining experience and continuing to expand our toolbox with advanced technologies and devices to help us produce the best outcomes for our patients in vascular surgery, cardiothoracic surgery and

cardiovascular medicine," says **Heather Haefner**, Executive Director of the Heart & Vascular Institute. "The Surgery Center project supports our expansion as an affiliate of the nation's premier heart and vascular institute with improved efficiency, more opportunities for collaboration and a focus on meeting the needs of patients and their families while in our care."

Williamsport Regional Medical Center is also working towards becoming a regional hub for cardiac care as part of Cleveland Clinic's arrangement with large national companies. Local employees of these companies may be referred to Williamsport Regional Medical Center for their care rather than having to travel to Cleveland.

Attracting High-Caliber Providers

Another factor accelerating the surgical program's expansion is the Heart & Vascular Institute's growing pool of highly skilled surgeons and specialists. Seven new providers have been recruited since June 2014, including an interventional cardiologist and an electrophysiologist.

"It's really a different recruiting situation than we're hearing about around the country. We have physicians contacting us about opportunities to work here," says Heather. "We're affiliated with the nation's best, we have an outstanding record for quality, and we're able to offer the best in technology and education. On top of that, we maintain that community hospital feel and ability to respond quickly to changes in the healthcare environment. It's very appealing, and it all contributes to our continued growth."



Quality at the Core

Before the affiliation with Cleveland Clinic, the Heart & Vascular Institute, under the direction of Dr. Lazar, fine-tuned processes to ensure better quality outcomes and improved patient safety. Those high standards have been maintained, earning the Heart & Vascular Institute patient satisfaction scores for overall quality at 98 percent and "courtesy of staff," rated at 98.5 percent. The cardiothoracic team has had no sternal wound infections, and length of stay and ventilation times are better than Society of Thoracic Surgeons' benchmarks.

"Our affiliation with Cleveland Clinic has ensured oversight at a nationally recognized standard of quality and allows us to recruit



exceptional new providers, train our current staff with the best of the best and provide patients

with a seamless second opinion without leaving the area," explains Dr. Lazar.

"Support from our community has been overwhelmingly positive, and patient satisfaction scores are at an all-time high. Overall, the affiliation has allowed us to perform at the level of a major academic medical center while allowing our patients to remain close to home in a smaller, more intimate setting."

Patient-Centered Care

Serving all surgical patients, the new Surgery Center will optimize quality while offering extreme comfort and convenience for patients and their loved ones. Patients who are nervous or whose health is compromised might find navigating hospital hallways before a scheduled surgery to be difficult, but the new Surgery Center's design creates a simple entrance into a comfortable setting to help patients and their loved ones immediately feel at ease. When the Surgery Center is completed, patients will be able to drive up to the Susquehanna Tower for valet parking, enter the lobby and take the elevator directly to the fourth floor. From the elevator, they will step into the Surgical Center's welcoming registration area to check in.

With a 35-bed pre- and post-operative unit adjacent to the Surgery Center's registration area, the center's design minimizes "shuffling" for patients and those accompanying them. A comfortable waiting area offers WiFi access and food and beverage establishments, including a coffee shop and Subway restaurant, as well as other amenities to help patients' loved ones remain comfortable even when a patient undergoes a long and complex procedure.

The new operating rooms will be equipped with state-of-the-art technology and designed for efficiency, patient safety and infection control. The electrophysiology (EP) labs are being designed and equipped based on Cleveland Clinic's best practices and equipment selections.

Currently, combined heart and vascular procedures—surgeries that incorporate both imaging and surgical elements—limit access for other cases. The new operating rooms will accommodate this surgical approach to improve access for all patients.

 replacement; transaortic valve
 replacement and repair; advanced
 aneurysm repair; chronic, total
 occlusion; and minimally invasive
 valve-replacement procedures
- Two general operating rooms—
 equipped with the most advanced surgical
 and imaging tools to accommodate a
 multitude of surgical needs

speak, and reliant on a ventilator for each breath. He was welcomed to the facility with the staff's promise of helping him get better. What followed in the ensuing three months until his discharge was remarkable improvement made possible by Rick's determination and the hospital staff's

In June, as a complication of pneumonia, Rick developed

encouragement and support.

syndrome that affects the nervous system. Within 24 hours of being diagnosed, he became completely paralyzed and dependent on a ventilator for breathing. After treatments at another facility and attempts to wean him from the ventilator failed, doctors told Rick's family his condition might never improve. In August, his girlfriend, **Beth Combs**, pushed for one more round of treatments, which was not successful. Then they decided to move Rick to Muncy Valley Hospital, which has the only chronic ventilator unit in the region.

The ventilator prevented Rick from speaking, and his only means of communicating was pointing to words and shrugging his shoulders. During the first week, a speech therapist helped Rick use a speaking valve attached to the ventilator to talk. After months of silence, everyone was thrilled to hear Rick

say, "Hello." During the emotional first session, he completed some counting and reading exercises, and then took the opportunity to say "I love you" to his girlfriend.

Weaning from the ventilator is a slow and steady process with a team of palliative care providers, including respiratory and speech therapists and a nutritionist. They assessed Rick's levels of comfort and anxiety as well as the continued improvement of his pulmonary function. Within a week, they felt Rick was ready for a five-minute breathing trial. After this first success, each subsequent trial was longer and more frequent. By September 6, just one month after his arrival, Rick was breathing on his own both day and night.

"They (the staff and therapists) were always there talking to me and joking with me. They gave me hope and made me want to fight," he says.

As Rick became independent from the ventilator, the speech therapists carefully supervised the introduction of drinks and soft food.

"One of the first things I asked for when I got off the ventilator was a drink of water," says Rick, also recalling his first meal of lasagna on August 22.

Because Rick had been paralyzed since June, moving him and keeping his muscles toned was also important. When he was first admitted, physical therapy staff came to his bedside to move his arms and

legs. They used a lift to get him in and out of bed so they could make larger motions.

As the staff got to know Rick, they indulged some of his interests.

Knowing that he was a motorcycle enthusiast, they took him outside on September 11 to see a memorial motorcycle brigade go by.

Rick's girlfriend was with him every day and appreciated how the therapists involved her in his care.

"They were excellent! They gave him

health and hope, and they were really good with me, too," says Beth.

Once weaned from the ventilator, Rick was able to ramp up his physical rehabilitation and learn how to use a wheelchair. One week, as he was re-learning to walk with the assistance of therapy bars, he joked with staff about how he would be walking by the weekend. Sure enough, that Friday he took several steps on his own.

"I was only joking, but they couldn't believe it," says Rick, laughing. "Soon I was walking every day."

Rick feels that the people and positive environment at Muncy Valley Hospital were what helped him respond so well to treatments. As his recovery progressed, his therapy sessions included making sure that he could do many of the tasks of

everyday living, such as showering, on his own. Now that he is home, he plans to continue with that spirit and recover enough to once again ride his motorcycle.

"We did a lot of joking around, and I teased them, too," says Rick. "They were funny and got me going, which helped me push myself."

In turn, the staff was deeply moved by Rick's determination. When it was time for his discharge in November, much earlier than anyone ever imagined, they threw him a going-away party.

"He just touched everybody's life here," says Nichole. "When we look at what he endured and where he

ended up—how he made the difference in his own outcome and could walk out of here without a ventilator or a trach—it gives you a different feeling as a caregiver. He gave us a light of hope that we can share with other patients. We can inspire them with Rick's story."

Pediatric Resuscitation Cart



Emergency treatment is not one size fits all.

Pediatric patients, for example, have little bodies and weigh less than adults, often requiring reduced doses of medicine, smaller IV bags, and tinier needles and tubes. When a child's heart or breathing has stopped, it is critical for caregivers to adjust quickly to differences in size. Thanks to a grant from the Tree House Fund, a new pediatric resuscitation cart at Muncy Valley Hospital Emergency Department is making it simpler, faster and safer for staff to take life-saving steps for their youngest patients.

The Muncy Valley Hospital Emergency
Department had previously been equipped
to render life-saving measures for children
by keeping the pediatric-sized tools and
medicine doses stored alongside those for
adults on standard crash carts. To realize
an optimal treatment scenario for children
in the new Emergency Department,
medical staff included a pediatric
resuscitation cart in their plan.

The cart is built to correspond with the Broselow tape, a universal measuring system used by medical staff to quickly determine proper doses and equipment sizes for patients—without having to weigh them. Colors on the tape indicate the size of tools and medicine doses appropriate for each patient size. The seven drawers

on the new pediatric resuscitation cart are each marked with a different color to correspond to recognized pediatric sizes—from the pink/red top drawer for the smallest, then purple, yellow, white, blue, orange and the green bottom drawer for the largest children. Inside each drawer is appropriately sized equipment to restore the patient's breathing or heartbeat. The cart also holds a defibrillator on top.

"The cart streamlines the process to make it faster and safer for the patient. If staff measure the patient at green, they can immediately open the green drawer without having to do any calculations or conversions," says **Sharon Adams**, RN, BSN, Manager of Patient Care for Muncy Valley Hospital Emergency Department. "Everything is available at their fingertips to enact a seamless, rapid response and get treatment started promptly."

The cart has been in the Muncy Valley
Hospital Emergency Department since
October 2014 thanks to the grant from the
Tree House Fund, a field of interest fund
within the First Community
Foundation Partnership of Pennsylvania.
The Tree House Fund supports

organizations focused on programming and projects that benefit children and youth in the north-central region of Pennsylvania.

Purchase of the cart coincided with the decision to equip other Susquehanna Health locations with this life-saving innovation, including the emergency departments at Williamsport Regional Medical Center and Soldiers + Sailors Memorial Hospital.





CONTRIBUTIONS AT VOCAN Free Lung Cancer Part of High-Dem Free Lung Cancer Screenings Part of High-Demand Outreach SusquehannaHealth.org/Giving

Forty high-risk individuals received free lung cancer screenings through a community outreach program funded by contributions to Susquehanna Health Foundation and the Susquehanna Health Cancer Center. The screenings, held in late summer 2014, were part of a Susquehanna Health community outreach program that is aimed at reducing the higher-than-average incidence of lung cancer in the region. Demand for the free low-dose computed tomography (LDCT) scans was so great that organizers stopped advertising them after just one week.

"We were absolutely surprised by the response," says Michelle Gaida, Executive Director of the Susquehanna Health Cancer Center. "Radiology had to expand both screening days from half days to full, eight-hour days. There is an interest and demand for the screening, but for many, the cost was a significant barrier."

Lung cancer is the deadliest cancer and third leading cause of death in the United States. According to the Centers for Disease Control, the incidence rate of lung cancer in Susquehanna Health's service area is higher than the state average. Pennsylvania Department of Health records also show that more Lycoming County adult residents smoke than the state average.

To combat these risks, Susquehanna Health began with education. Clinicians established a lung cancer and tobacco cessation booth for a community block party in early August. They surveyed and consulted with 45 adult smokers and found that 37 percent of them have a family history of cancer, and 35 percent were receptive to the idea of quitting as a result of that counseling.

"Quitting smoking is by far the best preventative measure for lung cancer," says Michelle. "Every component of our outreach includes smoking cessation education."

The free screening was offered next. Lung cancer screening is not an alternative to smoking cessation, but the U.S.

Preventative Services Task Force
(USPSTF) recently recommended that annual screenings with LDCT in high-risk individuals could prevent a substantial number of lung cancer-related deaths.

Susquehanna Health's free screening at the Medical Plaza at Montoursville included a commitment to follow-up screenings (per evidence-based guidelines) for participants until their insurance covers it.

Per USPSTF recommendations, participants were 55 to 80 years old with a 30-pack-a-year smoking history. Those who no longer smoked had to have quit within the past 15 years. A physician referral and tobacco use counseling were also required.

For 24 of the participants, the screenings revealed conditions such as emphysema, smoking-related lung disease, bronchiectasis, coronary calcifications and fatty liver. Two participants with "probably benign" findings were recommended for a follow-up screening in six months. All of the participants' referring providers received the screening results along with the USPSTF screening and Lung-RADS follow-up guidelines.

"Since those initial screenings, most commercial insurance companies are covering LDCT screenings for those who meet the eligibility criteria. Medicare just announced final plans for coverage too. Those changes could help get more cases of lung cancer detected earlier and possibly improve chances of survival," says Michelle. "Our outreach will continue to be important to tell the community about the scans and the life-saving value of smoking cessation."
